As an Erasmus+ Charter holder, and in line with our international strategy, NEOMA Business School is deeply committed to developing the linguistic and professional skills of our entire community.



Erasmus+ is Europe's benchmark mobility programme, giving millions of EU citizens the opportunity each year to study, train, teach or complete an internship across Europe and elsewhere in the world.

The Erasmus+ grant at NEOMA

The **NEOMA Erasmus+ grant** enables students to benefit from an academic and intercultural experience in Europe while receiving financial support from the EU. It offers a valuable opportunity to discover new cultures, gain independence, strengthen language skills and explore Europe.

Under Erasmus+, students at NEOMA Business School who take part in an academic exchange programme or an internship in an eligible country may receive financial support.

The purpose of this grant is to:

- Encourage international mobility
- Promote cultural and linguistic openness
- Reduce inequalities in access to mobility
- Support academic and professional pathways

The amount of the grant varies according to the destination country and the duration of the mobility period. Students participating in an academic exchange or internship lasting fewer than 60 days are not eligible for the Erasmus+ grant. NEOMA reserves the right to provide partial funding for student mobility (up to 75 days per semester), with the exception of scholarship students, who will receive full funding.

IMPORTANT: The total duration of Erasmus+ funding for studies and/or internships may not exceed 360 days over the entire length of a student's programme.

Eligibility criteria

The Erasmus+ programme is open to all students enrolled at NEOMA regardless of their nationality or financial situation.

Students do not need to take any special steps to benefit from the Erasmus+ grant. The Grant Centre will contact you directly to introduce the scheme and guide you through the necessary procedures.

Amounts

Below you will find information about the funding conditions for your Erasmus+ stay in Europe:

Calculation of the grant amount: Monthly amount × maximum number of days (75) / 30

Travel expenses

In addition to the amounts listed above, students may receive a contribution towards travel expenses. The distance in kilometres is calculated based on the distance between the location of your exchange or internship and your home campus:

INCLUSION supplement

To ensure that mobility is accessible to everyone, an “inclusion” financial supplement may be awarded to students who meet certain criteria, including social grant recipients, students with disabilities, students with long-term illnesses, or those facing specific economic or social challenges.

This bonus is designed to:

- Offset additional mobility-related expenses
- Facilitate international mobility
- Ensure the success of the project

The aim is clear: to ensure that all students, regardless of their circumstances, can benefit fully from their time abroad.

An additional €250 may be granted if you are in one of the following situations:

Eligibility criteria	Supporting documents
Having a disability or long-term illness (ALD)	Official decision from the MDPH (Departmental Office for People with Disabilities), long-term illness certificate, disability card, etc.
Residing in a municipality classified as a Rural Revitalisation Zone (ZRR) or at an address designated as a Priority Urban District (QPV)	Proof of residence (energy or water bill, house insurance, etc.) If the participant's name does not appear on the proof of residence, it must be accompanied by a sworn statement from the person providing accommodation or by an administrative certificate issued by the home institution, etc.
Higher education grant recipient based on social criteria, levels 6 and 7	Notification of award of CROUS national grant

Grant payment

The grant is paid to beneficiaries in two stages:

- 70% of the total amount is paid at the start of the internship or exchange once the contract has been registered.
- The remaining balance is paid on submitting proof of attendance and completion of the Erasmus+ questionnaire at the end of the internship or exchange.

Green Mobility Bonus

In line with its commitment to responsible and sustainable practices, NEOMA supports its students' environmental efforts by offering an incentive grant to anyone who opts for eco-friendly modes of transport for their academic exchange or international internship.

Thanks to this scheme, students can receive a Green Mobility Bonus on top of their Erasmus+ grant, depending on their destination. This additional grant is awarded, on presentation of supporting documents (round trip or outbound or return journey), to students who choose sustainable modes of transport to reach their host country, such as train, bus or carpooling.

This grant is designed to:

- Promote eco-friendly transport choices
- Encourage efforts to reduce the carbon footprint
- Provide financial support for longer but more sustainable journeys

Example 1:

*I'm travelling to Germany **by train** on a four-month exchange programme. The total amount of the travel grant would be:*

$€292 \times 75 \text{ days (max.)} / 30 \text{ days} = €730 + €285 \text{ travel expenses (eco-friendly transport allowance)} + €65 \text{ (Green Mobility Bonus)} = \mathbf{€1,080}$

Example 2:

*I'm travelling to Germany **by train** on a four-month exchange programme, **and I'm a level 3 grant holder**. The total amount of the travel grant would be:*

$€292 \times 120 \text{ days} / 30 \text{ days} = €1,168 + €285 \text{ travel expenses (eco-friendly transport allowance)} + €65 \text{ (Green Mobility Bonus)} = \mathbf{€1,518}$

Example 3:

*I'm travelling to Germany **by train** on a four-month exchange programme, **and I'm a level 6 grant holder (inclusion supplement)**. The total amount of the travel grant would be:*

$€292 + €250 \times 120 \text{ days} / 30 \text{ days} = €2,168 + €285 \text{ travel expenses (eco-friendly transport allowance)} + €65 \text{ (Green Mobility Bonus)} = \mathbf{€2,518}$
